#### Pet Safety & Holidays

As we enter the December festivities, our families gather and this means the 4-legged members also.

Here are a few pet safety tips:

- Toxic Plants During the holidays, plants play a prominent role in festive decorations. However, there are some types of decorative plants that are toxic to dogs and cats. In some cases, only mild indigestion and discomfort will result; in other cases, the toxicity can lead to more severe health problems, and even fatalities.
- Pets and Xmas Ornaments -Curious pets are often attracted to ornaments hanging from the Christmas tree. Treasured ornaments should be hung high up on the Christmas tree, so they are out of the reach of curious cats and rambunctious dogs. Wooden, metal, resin-cast or other durable ornaments should be used on the lower branches. Or, for your pet's safety, avoid placing any ornaments on the lower branches of the Christmas tree.
- Toys & Batteries If a pet chews on a hard plastic toy, they risk breaking their teeth. Batteries and board games contain zinc, which can cause pancreatitis and renal damage is ingested by a pet.

If you suspect that your dog or cat may have eaten a foreign object, visit your family veterinarian or your nearest emergency veterinary hospital for an examination and possibly x-rays.
